One of the most vocal proponents of using GPT technology to solve real-world problems has been DoNotPay, which dubs itself "The World's First Robot Lawyer." DoNotPay quickly got to work using generative AI to argue down bills and handle other simple and valuable, but typically time-consuming, tasks. It wasn't long till they upped the ante, announcing that DoNotPay's AI chatbot would be representing an actual defendant in New York traffic court, armed only with a smartphone, an earbud and an agreement to accept whatever outcome its robot lawyer achieved.

The announcement caused a stir, but DoNotPay wasn't done yet. In response to some who apparently claimed that traffic court was small potatoes, DoNotPay's CEO, Joshua Browder, took to Twitter with what he called a "serious offer" to pay any lawyer or person with an upcoming case before the U.S. Supreme Court \$1 million to let DoNotPay handle the arguments via AirPods connected to its robot lawyer.

Numerous Twitter users were quick to point out that the proposed arrangement could never happen, as SCOTUS bans all electronics from the courtroom while court is in session. They're not alone indeed, most courts don't permit personal electronic devices.

DoNotPay has reached a settlement in a [class action](#) alleging that the AI startup illegally claimed to practice law while billing itself as the "world's first robot lawyer".

The original [lawsuit](#), filed in March 2023 in the Superior Court of the State of California County of San Francisco, alleged that DoNotPay violated the State Bar Act, Cal. Bus. and Prof. Code §§ 6025, by falsely marketing its services as equivalent to those of lawyers authorized to practice law in the state of California.

"Unfortunately for its customers, DoNotPay is not actually a robot, a lawyer, nor a law firm. DoNotPay does not have a law degree, is not bonded in any jurisdiction, and is not supervised by any lawyer" wrote attorneys for the plaintiffs from Edelson PC.

### Air Canada Argues Lying AI Chatbot Was a Separate Legal Entity — and Loses

It was a small award but a much bigger warning that came out of a recent small claims court decision ordering Air Canada to compensate a customer over inaccurate information he got from the airline's AI-powered chatbot.

The British Columbia Civil Resolution Tribunal's (CRT) decision in *Moffat v. Air Canada* awarded customer Jake Moffat a little over C\$650 in damages but "represents a milestone in the expanding field of digital interactions and accountability," according to technology lawyer Benny Sockman.

Moffat went to Air Canada's website after his grandmother died to book a flight from Vancouver to Toronto using the airline's bereavement fares. He said he asked the site's chatbot about the reduced fares and it told him that he could book travel immediately and retroactively apply to get a partial refund. When he did, the airline denied his claim saying he did not follow the proper procedures to request the discounted fare.

Air Canada argued that it couldn't be held responsible for any information provided by its agents or representatives—including a chatbot.

"In effect, Air Canada suggests the chatbot is a separate legal entity that is responsible for its own actions," CRT member Christopher Rivers wrote in the decision. "This is a remarkable submission."

Rivers wrote that the chatbot is part of Air Canada's website and that "it should be obvious to Air Canada that it is responsible for all the information on its website."

Air Canada said in a statement that it will comply with the ruling.

Sockman, a technology lawyer and senior counsel with McCarthy Tétrault, wrote in a [2023 report](#) that the decision reaffirms a well-established principle that companies are responsible for acts or omissions of the systems they use and for misrepresentations they make to the public, whether that information comes from a person or a chatbot.

"The Air Canada case may be the first case to affirm this principle in the context of information provided by chatbots, but there is significant caselaw dealing with programmed computers to the same effect," he wrote.

The chatbot also gave Moffat a link to the airline's bereavement fare information page and claimed that page was the "controlling information"—another argument Rivers rejected.

Air Canada didn't say why that page was "inherently more trustworthy than its chatbot," or why customers should have to double-check information they are given by the chatbot, Rivers said.

Organizations will be held responsible for information provided by chatbots, wrote Kirsten Thompson, lead of the privacy and cybersecurity group at Dentons Canada in her [analysis of the case](#).




The maker of ChatGPT on Thursday unveiled its most powerful generative artificial intelligence tool and the first to create video from text in response to written commands.


But the high quality of videos created by Sora - which after 200 hours trained on vast amounts of video content - impressed observers who are wary about the ethical and societal implications.





with the concept of autonomous driving systems advancing by the day, huawei engineers have now developed a self-driving bicycle that can operate even if it is unattended. the newly invented bike can stand on its own even in complete balance even on the slimmest surfaces, while it also incorporates a series of impressive features such as high-precision sensors, image recognition camera, and AI technology to enable its autonomous driving.

as a first step, the developers started modeling a virtual bike on CAD, while adding a series of details that could transform it into an automatic driverless vehicle. they installed two large brushless motors and a steering gear to control the handlebars, and then added a sensor equipped with an HDSD depth camera, accelerometer, gyroscope, and a lidar. the bike uses a 45 model airplane power lithium battery, lasting about 2-3 hours, and the main control computing module is housed right below the seat, above the rear wheel.



to ensure that the bike stands on its own, the team has adopted a control module that uses the rotational moment of the disk, the same system that is also applied to artificial satellites. a small, high-precision sensor detects tilt and feeds back the data to the attitude control module so that it can react on its own. in addition, the creators have incorporated a system that rotates the rear wheels directly with a motor without pedaling.
