



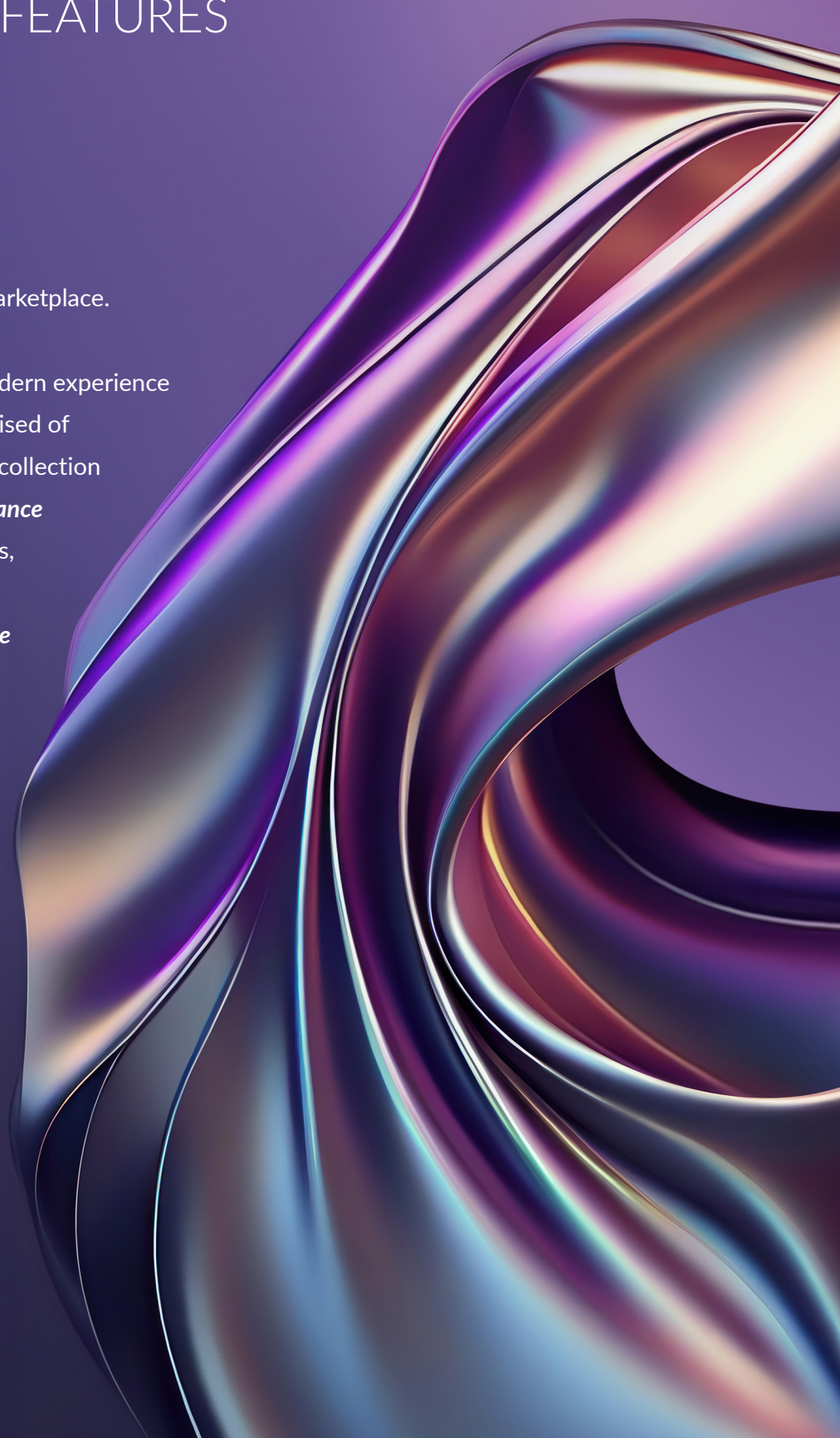

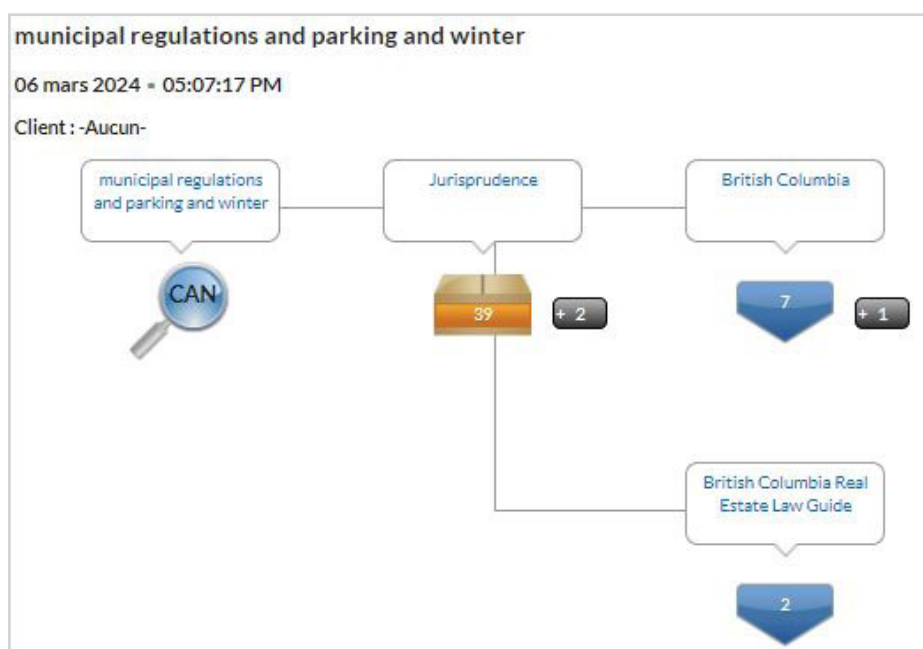

At common law, the length of any advance **employment termination notice** is determined by four central factors: (1) the character of the **employment**; (2) the length of service; (3) the age of the employee; and (4) the availability of similar **employment** having regard to the experience, training and qualifications of the employee. 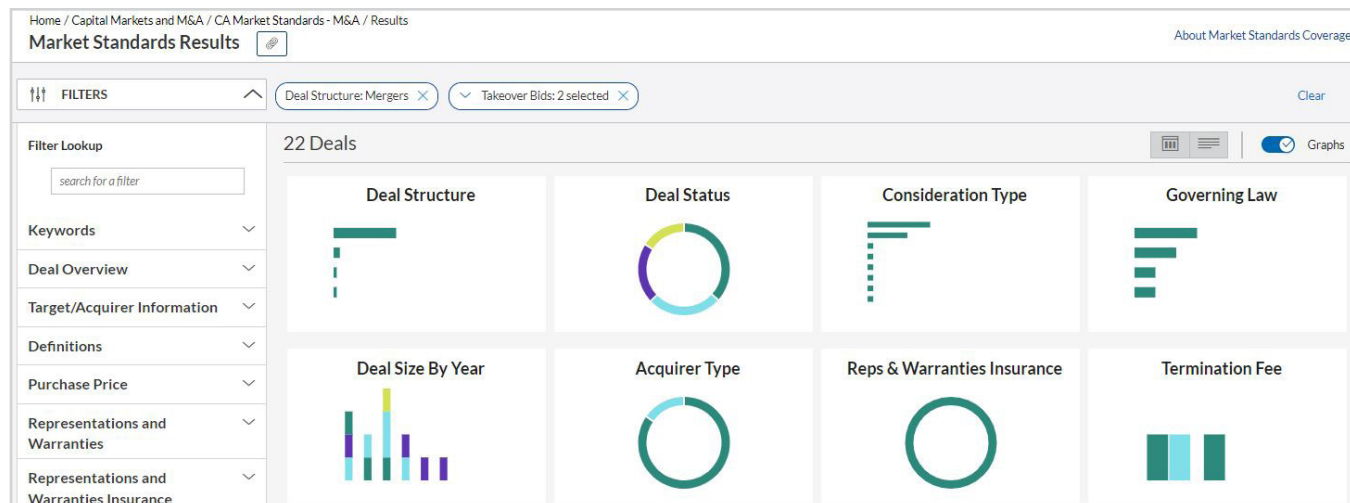
